Town Planning Commission meeting are held once a month on the third Wednesday. Planning meetings are only held if there is planning business. Planning meetings are also

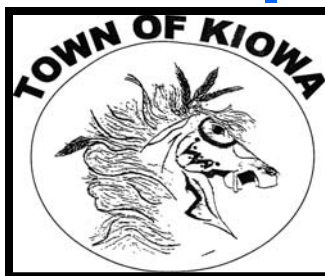
open to the public.

The following is a list of 10 Maintenance Duties that must be completed every year for your water system in your home:

1. Always keep meter clear and insulated properly.
2. Locate the shut offs for your home as well as your irrigation system.
3. Check valves for leakage to all your plumbing fixtures. This is a great time to clean out all pee-traps for proper flow.
4. Check all gaskets to all water related faucets.
5. Hot water Heater; Turn water and gas off; Flush-out completely. Activate Pressure relief valve; should drip for 5 minutes after activation; if it does not replace the valve.
6. Pressure release valve drain tube should be clean and free of debris and should drain to a floor drain.
7. AC units condensation tubes should drain outside.
8. Check valves and PRV valves should be checked yearly.
9. Backflows on Irrigation systems should be checked yearly.
10. Check all appliance fittings that use water. Check for leaks and gaskets that may be worn and need replacement.

If you follow these guidelines, you will insure and protect your home for minor problems that if unattended to, may cause major problems in the future.

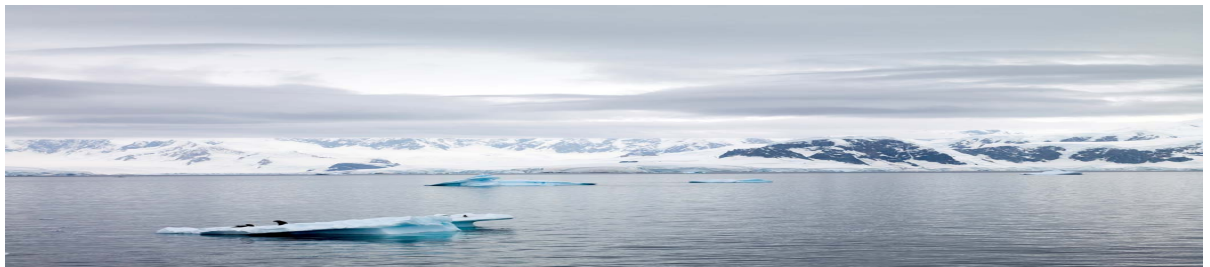

ORDINANCE NO.2008-1 Deposit of snow and ice on public roadway.

It is unlawful to remove any snow, ice or other debris from any parking lot, public sidewalk, private walk, private road, or private driveway and deposit or dump the same upon or into the public street, road or other public way.

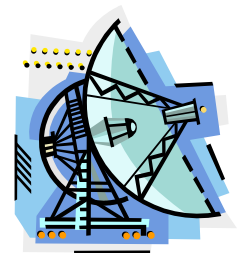
