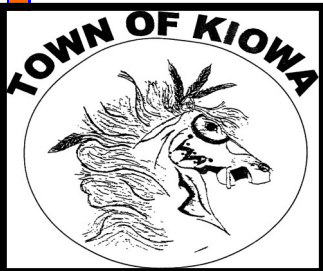

### Kiowa Police Department Update

There has been some confusion on how citizens contact the Kiowa Police Department. The Kiowa Police are currently dispatched through the Douglas County Sheriff Communications Center. The Kiowa Police continue to provide **around the clock police protection** to the Town of Kiowa. We urge all citizens to call when assistance is needed, no matter what the time of day. We have been contacted by people who have been the victims of incidents several days after the fact. Please keep in mind that if you wait to report a crime to the police, critical evidence or leads may be lost or altered making it difficult to conduct follow-up investigations. Never hesitate to call us. Please report any crime or incident to the Kiowa Police Department immediately, tomorrow or next week may be too late. Keep in mind its getting cold again so please insulate your meter and remember to leave a small constant stream running out of a tap in your home to prevent line freezing and meter damage. Also in home shut offs need to be located and tested, they should be easily accessible in case of emergencies. Remember the meter to the home is the homeowners responsibility if damage is done to the meter or service line repair will be at the homeowners expense. In small case's the Town may assist in repair, if a waiver has been signed.

Per Town Ordinance No. 2006-04, Section 13-17, Regarding Utility Billing and Delinquent Accounts;  
© .The Town shall impose a charge of Fifty dollars (\$50.00) following the receipt of a notification of disconnection.

The Town will begin enforcing a \$50.00 charge for all Utility Accounts that are DELINQUENT and reach **shut-off** dates, Due to the high number of SHUT-OFF'S, a \$50.00 charge will now be assessed after notification has been made to the customer.



The Town has added several pieces of equipment to the Streets department.

The equipment was purchased from CDOT at a great savings to the Town.

In the past, when blowing snow was covering the streets 5 or 6 passes had to be made around Town, now 2 passes is all it should take to clear roadways.

The roller we purchased will save the Town money in street repair. There will be no need to rent the equipment.

The air compressor has already paid for itself (no need to rent a compressor). It was used to blow out irrigation lines at both parks and Town Hall. The compressor will also be used for street repairs in the future.

The motor grader will save time on the alleyways and keep them in better repair. The big cost savings will be clearing Highway 86. The Town is responsible for clearing snow and removing ice from the street and gutter along 86. This will make parking along 86 easier and safer.

Many of you may have already noticed the new information signs. These signs will be used to promote events in Town as well as inform you of important information from the fire department, and other happenings.

#### **ORDINANCE NO.2008-1 Deposit of snow and ice on public roadway**

It is unlawful to remove any snow, ice or other debris from any parking lot, public sidewalk, private walk, private road, or private driveway and deposit or dump the same upon or into the public street, road or other public way.
